This document contains the instructions for preparing and typing camera-ready papers for the Third International Conference on Structural Health Monitoring of Intelligent Infrastructure (SHMII-3). Camera-ready papers will appear in print exactly as prepared by the author. Therefore, it is essential that the paper is accurately and attractively presented. Please see the Sample Pages Document as a guide.

Papers must not exceed 10 pages (tables and illustrations included) for regular papers and 14 pages for keynote papers.

All papers should be formatted to either 8 1/2" x 11" or A4 page size. Papers should be prepared electronically, preferably in Microsoft Word format. Please pay special attention to the instructions for placement of the paper's title on the first page. Follow all other instructions for placement of the text within the prescribed margins. Place a full page of text and figures on each page. All text should be single-spaced and fully justified, unless specified otherwise.

Margins: The size of the volume will be 15.5 x 23.5 cm. The area in which your text must be typed is 12.6 x 18.0 cm (see framed area in the sample pages).

Pagination: Please do not add page numbers within the text area (delineated by the frame on the attached pages). Final pagination will be done by the printer. However, to ensure that the pages of your manuscript are not confused, please number each page outside the print frame, in the lower left hand corner of the paper. Use the following format to number the pages: [*surname of the first author, followed by a shortened title of the paper (several words), and the page number/total number of pages in the manuscript*]. For example, the first page of a 10 page paper on "Monitoring of beams by fibre optic sensors" by John Smith, will read:
SMITH, "Monitoring of beams", 1/10.

Title Page Presentation: The title is placed 10 lines down from the top of the page. The author names and addresses are placed within the next 12 lines. The title "Abstract" starts 12 lines below the title line. Please see the sample page for proper placement of the Author names and addresses on the page.

Placement of Title and Authors' Names and Address:

Title: Place the title of the paper on the first page as indicated in the sample page (10 lines down from the top of the delimited area). The title should be typed in upper case letters (Times New Roman 13), right justified. Leave a double space before typing the authors' names and addresses. **Author Names and Addresses:** You should use upper and lower case, Times New Roman 10, right justified. Please do not include titles. Put the author address in the line immediately below the author name. The addresses should be abbreviated, affiliation and country only. Remember to put all author names and addresses in the blank 10 lines between the title of the paper and the heading "Abstract".

Type Style and Size for Text: The entire manuscript should be typed in Times New Roman. All headings should be bold, type size 11. All subheadings should be bold, type size 10. All body text should be type size 10.

Presentation of Manuscript:

Abstract: No more than 200 words. Type the heading "Abstract" 10 lines down from the title of the paper, remembering that the author names and addresses are contained within those 10 lines (see sample page). The word "Abstract" should be type size 11, bold, left justified. The text of the abstract should be type size 10.

Headings: Major headings should be in upper case letters (type size 11, left justified. Do not underline.) There should be a blank line before and after each major heading.

Subheadings: Bold upper and lower case, left justified, type size 10. There should be a blank line above each subheading and no lines below. Do not underline.

Text: Single-spaced, fully justified. When necessary to avoid a clash with adjacent lines (formulae, symbols), use at least an extra half-space. Indent the first line of each paragraph 1 centimeter or ½ an inch.

Equations and Units: Indent 3 spaces. Equations should be displayed to avoid clashing of superscripts and subscripts with the text above or below. Number each equation between parentheses at the far right margin. Use SI units. Use common abbreviations where possible ("% in place of "percent").

Figures: All figures should be in electronic format and inserted in your paper in the appropriate location (preferably at the top or bottom of a page) as close as possible to where they are first referred to in the text. The quality of your figures has a great effect on how your paper looks. Figures should be simple and clear. Please remember that they will appear exactly as presented in your manuscript.

Figure Captions: Figure captions should be separated from the figure by one blank line. The caption should include the figure number and caption text in 10 point Times New Roman, centered under the figure. Leave one blank line below the figure caption before resuming the body of the text.

Tables: All tables should be in electronic format and inserted in your paper in the appropriate location (preferably at the top or bottom of a page) as close as possible to where they are first referred to in the text. Keep tables simple. Tables and table headings should be left justified, Times New Roman 10 point. Do not spread tables out across the page. The table caption includes the table number and table title. There should be one blank line between the table caption and the actual table.

Footnotes: Avoid footnotes if possible. If you must use them, please be sure they are typed within the camera-ready specified margins as illustrated in the sample pages.

References: List and number all bibliographical references at the end of the paper under the major heading "References". Number the references in the order that they are referred to within the text. Authors are cautioned to give complete information about books and authors and to check spelling and dates carefully. The presentation of references is given in the attached example.
